

Marriage Vows

Marriage Vows can be an “I do,” or an “I will,” a repeat-after-me, or read to each other. The only legal requirement of a wedding ceremony is that the Bride and Groom verbally indicate they want to be married. The term Expression of Intent and Marriage Vows are really the same thing. You can have an Expression of Intent – which is an “I do” or an “I will.” You can also then have a repeat-after-me Marriage Vow, and then a separate repeat-after-me for the Ring Exchange.

Bde and Grm can be replaced with the names of the Bride and Groom. Command/shift/h for Word.

Combining the Vows and Ring Exchange

The Ring Exchange can be separate or be included in any vow by Judge Armstrong saying:

To Groom: Grm, as you place this ring on Bde’s finger, please repeat after me.

Or

To Groom: Grm, please place this ring on Bde’s finger.

Do you Grm take Bde as you wife etc. followed by an “I do.”

Write your own Vows

These are sample vows that can be changed as you like. Some are religious and some are not. You can delete words, add the words you choose, or write your own vows. These samples may help you with ideas. Don’t try to memorize your vows. You can read the vows to each other – Judge Armstrong holds the papers and hands a copy to the Bride and Groom at the appropriate time.

Repeat-after-me Vows

For repeat-after-me vows Judge Armstrong will read a few words at a time and the Bride and Groom repeat the words. The / mark shows the breaks in repeat-after-me vows.
